

## ETHICAL PRINCIPLES FOR AUTHORS

The ethical principles of “Study of Theological Sciences” are consistent with the guidelines of the Committee on Publication Ethics (COPE):

According to these guidelines, to respect ethical standards in the process of article publication

All actors involved in the work on the publication are obliged: the authors,

editors (thematic, content-related, linguistic), scientific council, reviewers and publisher.

### **Ethical principles for author:**

**Authorship:** The author of the publication is the one who has made a significant contribution to its the concept, execution and final interpretation of the data. Anyone who influenced these elements of the work, should be given among the authors.

**Scientific reliability:** The publication should be prepared meticulously according to editorial guidelines. Therefore, it must contain data to identify the sources and clear, transparent presentation of information. The bibliography shall show all publications used in writing the article.

**Originality and plagiarism:** Plagiarism or falsification of data in a scientific article are unacceptable. The author may only submit his own and original works for publication, which have not yet been published either on paper or on the Internet.
