

RULES FOR WRITING BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE

Authors of scientific articles (this does not apply to reviews, reports and discussions) should make a biographical note.

The note should have a volume of about 1000 characters (with spaces).

The note should contain the author's name, degree/title, current affiliation (if is), other relevant information about work/cooperation during the research career, short characteristics of research areas, list of the most important publications (regardless of the nature of the publication is given only the title in italics and the year of publication - in brackets), address the author's online correspondence.

Example:

Rudolf Konieczny, clergyman of the Roman Catholic Church (diocese of Zielona Góra and Gorzów), doctor habilitated in theology, professor of the Jagiellonian University, head of the Department of Comparative Theology at the Faculty of Theology of the Jagiellonian University, collaborates with the Pope the Lateran University of Rome and the Ecumenical Institute of the University of Hamburg; regular contributor to "Tygodnik Podhalański"; winner of the Polish Prize of the Theological Society "Community" in 2018. Research areas: Theology of the Reformation in the 16th century, ecumenism, joint Catholic-Lutheran initiatives, anathematic history, documents Ecumenical Magisterium. He published: *Kroki ku jedności. Szkice z teologii porównawczej* (2010), „*Niech będzie wyłączony*”. *Historia anatem* (2012) and *Między ekumenizmem a poprawnością polityczną* (2013), *Tajemnice wielkich herezji* (2015). *Współredaktor Wielkiego Słownika Ekumenicznego* (2017).
